EXPANDED PROGRAMS:

- **Gleaning:** Increased harvests and pick ups from backyards and farms to redistribute to our meal-making partners.
- **Coalition Building:** Co-chair of the Marin County Disaster Feeding Workgroup and the California Food Recovery Coalition
- Holiday Meal Delivery: Created and distributed 680 turkey meals in San Francisco and Marin during the holidays




Meaningful Impact In 2023

Goals for 2024

- Recover 4 million pounds of fresh, healthy food for redistribution and increase the number of freshly made meals to 25,000
- Expand growth into Sonoma County
- Add additional **refrigerated vehicle** to our fleet to rescue
- Recruit, train, equip, and support 75 new community volunteers to rescue food, glean from farms and gardens, and deliver fresh groceries and meals throughout their communities.
- Enroll 50 new businesses into our food donation program so that they can be compliant with CA Food Waste Law SB 1383 and so that excess fresh food is not thrown into the landfill.
- Bring on and support 50 new food distribution partners to expand our food safety net, make our community safer during a disaster or emergency, and increase access to nutritious food forour most needy neighbors.
