When people have reliable access to nourishing food, children can thrive in school, adults can pursue meaningful work and financial stability, and seniors can live independently with dignity and respect.

2024 Highlights

OVERALL IMPACT ACROSS THE BAY AREA:

- Over 4.5 million pounds of surplus food recovered.
- 40,000 food recovery trips completed.
- Fresh, nutritious food recovered from more than 400 food donors, including grocery stores, restaurants, farms, and more.
- Delivered food to over 230 community partners, including food pantries, shelters, after-school programs, and senior housing sites.

GROWTH IN SAN FRANCISCO:

- Over 3.1 million pounds of surplus food recovered in San Francisco alone — rescued from landfills and redirected to families in need.
- 2.5 million meals delivered doubling our impact from 1.25 million meals in 2023.

GOING GREEN: SUSTAINABILITY IN ACTION

• 20% of our fleet went fully electric. This transition will reduce our carbon footprint by 28.6 metric tons of CO2 annually — equivalent to taking 6 gas-powered cars off the road.

EXPANDING THE SAFETY NET:

• Increased number of food-insecure people we served from 20,000 to 35,000, strengthening the safety net in the Bay Area

INCREASING COLD STORAGE:

 Procured and delivered 37 fridges and freezers for 22 recipient partners, including our SOUPer Food Kitchen, allowing our community to store more of the fresh food we recover for them.

GLEANING:


• Over 300 households, community gardens, and farms contributed nearly 20,000 lbs of fresh, healthy produce.

LAUNCHED FOOD RECOVERY PROGRAM IN SONOMA VALLEY:


 Recovered nearly 100,000 pounds of surplus food and served over 3,000 people in Sonoma facing food insecurity

Looking Ahead to 2025

- ☑ GLEANING: Expanding program to pick up backyard produce in Sonoma Valley and San Francisco
- CASH ASSISTANCE: Adding San Francisco to our. low-income senior farmers market program, helping more seniors afford more fresh, local produce (3 farmer's markets in SF)
- ✓ INCREASED MEAL MAKING: Increasing number of days in the kitchen and meals produced by utilizing another commercial kitchen in San Francisco
- INCREASED CAPACITY of fresh food storage through infrastructure improvements and cold storage at 30 partner sites
