- [Ritter Center](#) received \$15,000 to assist with the relocation of holistic health and social services to Marin residents who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.
- [Enriching Lives Through Music](#) received \$15,000 to expand its programs serving low-income families, inspiring youth from underserved neighborhoods to thrive emotionally, socially and academically through music.

MarinSpace was founded on a deep-seated belief in collaboration, so it’s only fitting that our asset distribution should help vital nonprofits doing varied yet equally critical work to help keep our Marin community thriving.”

About MarinSpace

Founded in 1988, MarinSpace was born out of the collaborative effort of multiple organizations that came together to create a nonprofit co-location center. Over the years MarinSpace expanded collaboration-related efforts beyond the Skyview Nonprofit Campus to include non-facility-based consulting and project management services. MarinSpace’s focus was to help groups of organizations work together more effectively so they could scale their impact. Executive Director Shelley Hamilton was hired in 2003. When Ms. Hamilton stepped down from her position to focus on project-based consulting in 2017, the MarinSpace Board of Directors dissolved the organization and distributed its \$2.8 million in assets to other nonprofits in Marin County.
